Classroom Supplement for Housing Precarity: When Renters Struggle to Find and Keep a Home

Discussion Topics and Questions

What does it mean to suggest "the rent eats first"?

What are the most significant underlying forces enabling the rise of housing-cost burdens in the United States over the past 50 years?

If some policy alternatives already exist, yet not at the scale needed to alleviate long-term housing-cost burdens, how would you recommend policymakers "scale up" or expand well-meaning but often ineffective policy?

How might societal factors play a role in delaying or preventing success in using a housing voucher? Are there social factors or trends among certain demographic groups that may increase successful lease-up efforts?

How will using Small Area Fair Market Rents rather than city-wide fair market rent values help voucher recipients find homes is a wider range of neighborhoods?

Why have persistent narratives developed around housing displacement centering on gentrification at the expense of the much more common experience of eviction? What effects might this have on efforts to reduce unfair evictions?

Robust evidence supports the authors' assertion that eviction trends over the course of decades can be considered a racialized phenomenon. What does this mean and why is it important to acknowledge this as a systemic factor?
